YOUR COUNCIL CHAPLIN

During my time as chaplain at Camp Shenandoah, I would often ask the adults at camp about their careers. The idea being that I would invite them to speak with the Citizenship in the Nation and Community classes that I taught. One summer, there was a Scouter from northern Virginia who worked for the Fairfax Fire Department. I invited him to speak with the class and he agreed.

The day he was speaking with us, he arrived a little late and apologized to us for it. He shared his story of being a lieutenant in the fire department and how being an Eagle Scout had prepared him for this experience. Then he told us of his experiences on 9/11, one of the most impactful days for first responders in our country. You see, not only was he a firefighter, but so was his brother. His brother was in the World Trade Center on the 92nd floor when it collapsed and he had received that news before he was dispatched to battle the fires at the Pentagon that day.

He worked long hours to put out the fires started by the impact of American Airlines Flight 77, and when you see video of images of the firefighters on top of the roof that day, he is among them, the white helmet of a lieutenant sticking out in the imagery. He said that while he was there, he took a brief moment to catch his breath and looked out on the horizon. A city always filled with commotion and noise was silent. No traffic, on the ground or in the air, just silence. He turned and looked back to the wreckage and the sound engulfed him. He knew at that moment that God was with him.

When he finished telling his story, one young man queried how he could do that? How could he have done that knowing his brother had just died? His answer was simply "because it was my job." Scouting prepares us to face many challenges in life. Most of them are small, but some are significantly more difficult.

Camp Shenandoah Weekends – September Aquatics Report, Upcoming November Welding

Over the weekend of September 7-8 an Aquatics Merit Badge Weekend event was held on sparkling, brisk waters of Lake Hope. Aquatics merit badges including Swimming, Lifesaving, Canoeing and Kayak were offered on both days. We had around 90 Scouts participate, and a significant number of merit badges earned. In addition, that Saturday, Swimming and Water Rescue Training was offered. This a training program for older Scouts and adult Leaders to gain practical experience in safe swimming practices, how to safely conduct swim checks, how to manage a unit swim and finally, participants learned basic in-the -water skills to teach their troop's unit Response Personnel to help with unit swims. Twelve adults completed the course and now the council has 12 more points of contact for conducting unit swims and potential Lifesaving Merit Badge Counselors. The Staff for the weekend was outstanding with a record 5 Scouting America National Aquatic Instructors and very highly skilled youth staff supporting the program

On **November 9th** we will hold an all-day session of **Welding Merit Badge** and a concurrent session of Home Maintenance and Painting Merit Badges. As this is only a one-day program and to keep class sizes at a number such that the Scouts will receive a great experience, registration numbers will be limited. More information on the event and registration will appear in mid-October in District social media announcements and on the council website.

In the Spring we have already have plans for two CS Weekends, including programming for Wilderness and Remote First Aid, and Aquatics – Boating merit badges and Paddle Craft Safety training. The dates will be announced in January 2025.

Camp Shenandoah Camping Committee

The Camping Committee has reviewed the reports and surveys from Camp Shenandoah 2024, and they are very positive with many comments highlighting the outstanding staff and camp leadership in place last summer. With that as our foundation we have been working on a new daily schedule for camp programs which will give Scouts more time with their units to enjoy troop activities offered by camp. Also, we will be announcing new programs at camp including 3D Printing, Composite Materials, Metal Working and Blacksmithing. We have held several meetings with council experts in these domains and we believe we have identified the programs.

The committee has a couple more programming concepts which we will announce later in the fall. We hope to have the Leader's Guide available very soon as well as opening early registration (at an Early Bird price!).

Finally, we are actively recruiting staff. This year we hope to hire more staff and to develop a staff program offering more time for personal growth and building strong relationships amongst the staff. Bottom-line, Camp Shenandoah is going be a great place to work and have Scouting fun next year. Please send in applications to council office now.

Auto-Renewal Membership

For all youth and adult members of the BSA

Note: All registrations are for 12 months. For example, if your current registration expires on 12/31/2023, your renewed membership will start on 1/1/2024 and run through the entire calendar year until 12/31/2024. Membership renewal can be completed by either the individual, the family or the unit.

Auto Renewal Membership Family/Self Pay


- An email notification and a renewal link will be sent 60 days before membership expires.
- The link provided in the email will direct individuals to a renewal form on My.Scouting
- If registered in multiple positions, select the primary position. Renewing the primary position will automatically renew multiple positions.
- The individual pays with a credit card and submits the renewal.
- The unit will approve the membership renewal.

Auto Renewal Membership Unit Pay

- In Organization Manager, the unit selects the Unit Pay option.
- Unit Key 3s are notified each month about which members are due to renew that month.
- Using the Roster tab, the unit selects which members they are renewing.
- The unit can choose not to renew a member (opt-out). The unit can also change the Scout's Life subscription settings for each person.
- The unit pays with a credit card or establishes a securely stored electronic fund transfer payment (ACH) and submits the renewal.

Unit Key3 can find out which memberships have **expired** or are **due to renew**, then **batch** and **approve** any **Membership Renewals** in <u>my.scouting.org</u> under Organization Manager/Roster.


