Classes will be overseen by trained members of the Virginia Headwaters Council (VAHC) Aquatics Committee. Parents/Leaders are welcome to watch and/or participate. **Pre-registration is required for all classes.** 

Swim Checks: If Scouts do not have a current Swim Check status on file with us (valid for one year), these are included for Scouts BSA class offerings, but this time are NOT being offered as a stand-alone event for others. Swim Checks forms will be emailed to unit leaders after the event. Open Swim Checks will be offered for Scouts, parents, and leaders in June 2025.

#### 1. Swimming and Lifesaving Merit Badge Classes

DATE / TIME: Saturday Sept 7th or Sunday Sept 8th, 10:00am - 4:00pm

COST: \$30 to support camp (pay at sign in, cash or check to "Virginia Headwaters Council")

MAX CLASS SIZE EACH DAY: Swimming = 16, Lifesaving = 16

PRE-REQUISITES: You MUST already have earned the Swimming Merit Badge to take Lifesaving! Note: If you need both MBs, you can take Swimming on Saturday and then Lifesaving on Sunday.

**WHAT TO BRING**: Medical Form Parts A/B, Blue Cards (Scoutbook sign-off is highly preferred, save the blue trees, instructions will be provided), full water bottle, sunscreen, closed-toe water shoes (optional), lunch/snacks/drinks if desired, towel, change of clothes (please arrive in your swimsuit ready to roll)

#### 2. Kayaking, Canoeing, and Small Boat Sailing Merit Badge Classes

DATE / TIME: Saturday Sept 7th or Sunday Sept 8th, 10:00am - 4:00pm

This Labor Day weekend, BSA Troops 29, 92, and 5 had the opportunity to travel to Norfolk, VA, and tour several of the US Navy's finest warships. With the assistance of NAVAIR's events

coordinator, leaders and scouts underwent security screening before being allowed on base. As we drove to our first destination, scouts observed various Navy ships, a C-130 aircraft landing, and even a K-9 training facility. Upon arriving at Pier 6, we were greeted by LTJG Weinberger, who escorted us down the pier and led us on a tour of the USS Gonzalez DDG 66. We began at the bow of the ship, where we learned about its 5-inch deck gun and took some great photos. We then explored the ship, with scouts particularly enjoying the bridge, where we learned about the team responsible for controlling the ship and took turns sitting in the Commanding Officer's chair. Our tour continued through the wardroom, where officers eat, work, and relax, and the crew's mess, which provided more opportunities for engaging conversations, questions, and photos. Our final stop was the Combat Systems Suite (CSS), where we saw how weapons and radar systems are used to ensure the ship's safety and mission success. As we concluded our tour and went ashore, we expressed our gratitude to our hosts for the opportunity and their service.

The excitement didn't end there. We proceeded to another pier and met the Weapons Officer of the USS Washington SSN-787, who introduced us to the duty chief and engineer. Troop 92 had a special treat as the Engineering Officer, a female—a position not allowed on submarine duty until 2010—demonstrated what female officers in the Navy are capable of. Though no cameras were allowed for security reasons, this was a minor sacrifice for such a valuable experience. We entered the Virginia-class submarine with a quick shout of "Down Ladder" and explored the forward compartment, including the torpedo room, auxiliary machinery room (AMR), berthing, control, crew's mess, escape trunk, wardroom, officers' quarters, and countermeasures space. Scouts showed particular interest in the Mk-48 ADCAP torpedoes and torpedo tubes, as well as the sonar and fire control systems in the control room. They learned that food is the only limiting factor for how long they can remain submerged, as the submarine can produce its own air and water. The crew spent at least 90 minutes answering every question the scouts had. We concluded our tour with another shout of "Up Ladder" and returned to the pier, where multiple crew members continued to answer questions.

Author's note. I am the Scoutmaster of Troop 29. After I earned the rank of Eagle Scout I joined the Navy and spent 5 years in submarine service. I served on the USS Boise and USS Newport News. Scouting taught me invaluable lessons in teamwork, leadership, and preparedness, which served me well in submarine service. 17 years ago I departed the Navy and started a civilian life. Now that I have a son, I wanted to share with him the unique lifestyle and environment of being on a sub.
